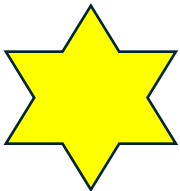

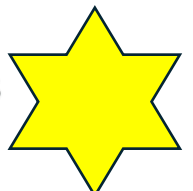

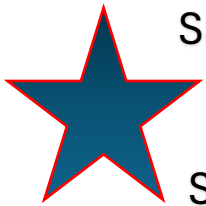

## INFORMATION

- Plaiting is optional.
- Horse Registration and Membership forms are available on our website [www.nzpinto.com](http://www.nzpinto.com).
- Back numbers are to be supplied by the competitor.
- The show programme will be emailed.
- You can choose to enter your horse in either Heavyweight, Lightweight or Middleweight.
- Age of horse is recognised as 1<sup>st</sup> August.
- Age of the Rider or Handler is as 1<sup>st</sup> August.
- The NZ Pinto Horse Society Committee reserves the right to alter or delete the programme as they see fit.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Horses MUST be registered and the owner a financial member of the NZ Pinto Horse Society at close of entries.
2. No trimming of horse's whiskers or inner ear is permitted. Refer to the RAS website for more information.
3. It is recommended you have a current RAS Height Certificate for the 2024/2025 Show Season. No measuring available on the day. Failure to produce a current certificate if asked may result in elimination with no refund.
4. All riders must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when riding. Helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards, the list can be found at [www.ras.org.nz](http://www.ras.org.nz) – equestrian. All helmets must be identified by the current tag system.

### 5. **Colts and Stallions**

ALL Colts or Stallions 12 months and over, must be shown in a bridle and bit and Miniature horses in a halter and stallion chain.

It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle.

The rider/handler must also wear two RAS official (2) armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring.

The handlers/riders must wear an approved Hi Viz vest when outside the showing ring.

Pony Stallions must be ridden by riders 14 years and over also refer Novice pony rule. Stallions over 148cm must be led or ridden by a handler/rider 17 years of age or older.

No colts or stallions are not to be left unattended including unattended tied to floats/trucks at any time while on the show grounds.

Colts or stallions will be eliminated with no refund given if rule 5 is not adhered to.

## 6. Novice

Not to have won more than 5 wins in a Pinto conformation class or Best Registered Pinto class. Novice wins include all RAS affiliated shows, Horse of the Year and NZ Pinto Horse Society shows at close of entries.

Novices are eligible to enter Open classes.

Novice Ponies can be ridden by riders over 17 years in the Novice class only. They are not eligible for the Open Championship if ridden by a rider over 17 years of age.

7. **Open Ponies** must be ridden by riders 17 years and under in all classes.
8. **Protests** must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit, refundable if the protest is sustained and submitted no later than half an hour after the incident that gave rise to the protest.
9. Any competitor or spectator found mistreating a horse, competing a horse deemed to be lame by the judge, arguing/fighting or being abusive to other competitors, judges or officials will be eliminated with no refund and asked to leave the grounds immediately. This includes ringside behaviour.
10. In the event of sickness or injury, 75% of total entry fees will be refunded if a qualified Veterinarian or Doctors certificate is produced to the Show Secretary within 5 working days of the competition. No other refunds will be made.
11. NZ Pinto Horse Society accepts no responsibility for injury, loss or damage to Property, Horse, Handler, Rider or Spectator.
12. Any Lapels, Badges, Rugs or similar that identify previous awards won are banned from being worn on the rider/handler or horse/pony in or near the ring.
13. An official can order any horse considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the owner/exhibitor/competitor.
14. **ALL manure/hay/rubbish must be picked up and taken with you from yards and around floats/trucks etc.**
15. Supreme Winners Prize Money

The NZ Pinto Horse Society offers \$300 for the **Supreme Inhand winner** and \$300 for the **Supreme Ridden winner** with a cap of \$500 if the same horse wins both. The prize is only given if the horse competes in the Pinto section at the Horse of the Year Show (HOY) 2025 in a minimum of 3 classes.

A copy of the receipt of your HOY entry must be provided to the Society Secretary. Payment will be made 5 working days after the completion of HOY 2025. Not transferable to any other horse or if the horse is sold. If the horse entered doesn't compete on the day or if HOY 2025 is cancelled the prize will not be paid unless the committee decides otherwise. If prize is not claimed by 1<sup>st</sup> March 2025 the prize is forfeited.

10. Adult 4 years & over, over 148cm but not to exceed 158cm
11. Adult 4 years & over, over 158cm

19. Pony 3 years & under, to mature under 148cm
20. Pony 4 years & over, not to exceed 148cm

### **Champion & Reserve Lightweight/Middleweight Pony**

judged from 1<sup>st</sup> placegetters in classes 19 & 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> placegetters to stand by

21. Adult Lightweight 4 years & over, over 148cm
22. Adult Middleweight 4 years & over, over 148cm

- 27. Novice Pony 0 to 5 wins, not to exceed 148cm, 1<sup>st</sup> placegetter to go forward for Champion Novice
- 28. Novice Heavyweight 0 to 5 wins, over 148cm, 1<sup>st</sup> placegetter to go forward for Champion Novice
- 29. Open Pony, not to exceed 148cm
